the help of support workers. We were also delighted to welcome more people back to our Day Resources, and have created safe spaces following COVID secure guidelines. I know this isn't an option for everyone and so we are continuing to offer online activities and sessions that you can access from home on a computer or tablet. If you've not tried an online session yet, do give it a go. I've joined some sessions over the last few weeks and seen how much fun people are having! A favourite was our first virtual Fun Day at the end of July where we were joined by some familiar faces to dance, sign, craft and exercise. There are some lovely photos in this issue of people taking part and you can still watch the highlights on YouTube.

Everyone has had to adapt over the last few months including Kent County Council who recently introduced an exciting new scheme called KARA, which we are very proud to be part of. KARA provides simple tablets connected to the phone line giving people easy access to their chosen friends and family. Over 80 of our members are now connected in this way.

You will see from the long list of 'Thank yous' that the generosity of people during this crisis has been wonderful. I wanted to add my personal thanks to everyone who has supported East Kent Mencap, including staff, volunteers, members, families and friends.

If you know anyone who would like to know more about our work and the difference their support


could make, do share this newsletter with them and encourage them to sign up to receive future issues by emailing or calling us.

Update on our services

East Kent Mencap goes above and beyond to ensure our members are supported, whatever the situation. With the pandemic and lockdown, we have altered how we deliver our services, with some becoming virtual and additional safety measures being put in place. Below is an outline of how our services are currently running.

Day Resource—Our Day Resources in Herne Bay, Margate, Ramsgate and Sheerness are conducting some sessions virtually, and some in person with social distancing. Our Day Resource members have been grouped in 'bubbles', so that contact between people is limited to small numbers. We've increased our cleaning protocols, including having temperature checks when entering our building and with staff wearing PPE.

Community Support and Housing— We are continuing to support members in their homes and to access their local community safely, with staff wearing PPE and hygiene standards being kept high. We have recently supported members to move into vacant rooms in one of our properties and a property recently purchased by the charity, to receive additional support during lockdown.

Children and Youth—We are continuing to support children and young people with complex needs at our centres, with staff wearing PPE. We have reorganised rooms and office spaces in our buildings to provide a greater number of suitable spaces for this service, to ensure that social distancing is maintained.

GOLD—Our GOLD team are keeping in regular contact with their members, organising virtual social sessions, answering questions, giving advice and keeping everyone connected.

KARA—Many of our members are now using KARA tablets provided by Kent County Council, supported by East Kent Mencap. This is a new accessible way to communicate virtually, to keep in touch with friends, receive reminders, and access valuable support while shielding. Read on for more information!

Events and Clubs—We will not be holding large events or clubs this year, however we have an exciting calendar of virtual events planned for members to get involved with from home! Read on to find out more.

ScrapStore @ EKM– The ScrapStore @ EKM is now open virtually! Check out this new green initiative our GOLD team are running, offering craft supplies at affordable prices, on Instagram @scrapstore.ekm



Gardening at Herne Bay Day Resource

Herne Bay Day Resource are transforming their outside space into a green haven, thanks to funding from Canterbury City Council and Tesco Bags of Help. Open spaces and gardens have become important during the pandemic as a place for staying fit or simply relaxing. Originally, the council agreed to fund a new fitness club but the virus meant all clubs had to be cancelled so EKM's Herne Bay Coordinators, Kelly and Louise, came up with the idea of a 'Green Gym', an outside area for exercise at whatever level suits the individual, from digging to pruning. 

New communications service for members

East Kent Mencap was delighted to be chosen by Kent County Council to take part in their new service, KARA, providing vulnerable people across Kent with virtual care and support via video carephones. In partnership with RETHINK Partners and Alcove, Kent County Council launched the KARA service as part of a response to the coronavirus pandemic. Even those with little or no technical ability are now able to connect with loved ones and caregivers. KCC have commented that EKM was the 'most productive organization' taking part in the programme as our staff have so far supported the rollout of 75 units to members with tablets still going out. Members tell us they are making great use of their tablets!




Virtual Fun Day

A new home brings a new start

Two of our members are looking forward to a new start after East Kent Mencap purchased a house for them!

Our member Stephen originally asked EKM for advice for him and his flatmate, Nick, as they were having some problems with their current home. Housing Manager, Kim Dorman, commented that, 'finding good

rental properties in Thanet can be tricky, so the best solution was to buy a house that suited their needs where they could live for as long as they wanted. We were fortunate to find the property in Ramsgate, not far from where they



were living. It even has a small garden they can enjoy during good weather. Our homes are even more important at the moment and we were delighted to be able to help Stephen and Nick find their perfect home.'

Despite the ongoing crisis, the purchase went ahead at the end of March. There was some work to do on the house before the tenants could move in, which was carried out with due care to social distancing.

East Kent Mencap has a number of properties for people with a learning disability with support ranging from 24 hours to a few hours a week, enabling tenants to live as independently as possible. It is undergoing a period of modernisation, upgrading its older properties and investing in new housing across East Kent.

Stephen and Nick have now moved in and are delighted with their new home saying, 'it is much bigger than our flat and it will be lovely to sit in the garden with a beer!!
