Reper Paste Con Con Con Con	Recycling bins have been put inside day services. We're working with the Thanet Day service to find the best way members can be supported with the process of recycling.
	Members asked us to discuss the best way of communicating staff changes caused by rising Covid cases. These changes are now in place and working well.
	Tenants in one of our houses asked about replacing their lounge sofas. Together with the Housing Manager, they chose a suitable sofa.
	Members and staff requested more Easy Read copies of forms such as Complaints/Compliments and Policies. We're working with Fiona to create Easy Read forms. These will be available soon.
Bank	Stephen and Natasha attended a Bank of England Forum on Zoom on behalf of EKM. There were many people with a learning disability from across the UK on the call. The forum discussed difficulties people with a disability face when using cash or card to make payments and when applying for jobs. Stephen and Natasha made some important and valuable points. They were very proud to be able to speak on behalf of themselves and their friends at EKM.
	The Virtual Valentine Disco was a huge success; members really enjoyed it and thanked our Support Worker Tris Kennedy who volunteered to DJ.
	In some day services, members have chosen their new sessions, starting in April.
	We know the number of people with Covid-19 has been rising recently. We wish anyone who has tested positive a very speedy recovery. EKM continues to take measures to ensure members' safety, at all sessions and centres.

Thank you to all the staff at EKM for the continued support they give. While rules often change, we still feel safe, listened to, valued and supported.

Employment

Heritage

Our History Group in Thanet have been exploring the Blue Plaques Trail and learning more about their heritage. In April they are working with CITiZAN (Coastal and Intertidal Zone Archaeological Network) as part of the Walk Create Project along the Kent coastline. Our groups at GOLD and Herne Bay will also be taking part and the hope is to produce a book featuring everyone's contributions!



Meet Sharon



Support Worker, Sharon Cosgrove, joined EKM at the start of 2022, to support people who use a video care phone. The system, known as Kara, provides vulnerable people with virtual care and support via video carephones. Those with little or no technical ability, are able to connect with loved ones and caregivers. This means that, wherever you are, there is always someone you can speak to if you need help, have a problem, or want a chat.

Sharon explains that the Kara has a screen, so you can see each other, as well as hear them. Her job is to call people on their Kara phone to have a chat and check if they need anything. She can also ensure the person feels safe, is not lonely, or if they have any health concerns.

It varies how often she speaks to people. She calls some people every day, and others two or three times a week. It's not always at a set time everyday and, if they are busy, she will always call them back later. She said at first it felt strange, not having met any of the individuals, but after a few conversations, it is more like speaking to a friend. Sharon said, 'Now we chat away about anything and everything. Even if I call and someone is a bit down, by the end of the conversation we are usually laughing. If they do have a concern, I put them in touch with someone who can help. I'm amazed by the different skills of the people I speak to. One plays the piano, another the guitar and one often sings and dances! I even do the cleaning with one person – we grab our dusters and clean together while we chat.'

Sharon understands that a simple conversation and a friendly face can make a real difference. Some of the people I call aren't able to get out of the house, and rarely see anyone else. I feel very lucky to be the person whom they look forward to seeing. I tend to rush around a lot but when I see someone on the screen to talk about their day, and hear how they are coping, it reminds me to calm down and enjoy every moment.

Easy Easter Nest Krispie Cakes Recipe

Ingredients:

- 225 grams of chocolate chopped or broken up roughly
- 75 grams of cornflakes or rice krispies
- 50 grams of butter
- 2 tablespoons of golden syrup
- 36 mini eggs

Method:

- Line a 12-hole fairy cake tin with 12 paper cases.
- Put the chocolate, golden syrup and butter in a bowl. Heat up the mixture for 10 seconds in the microwave. Stir the mixture and cook in the microwave for another 10 seconds.
- Stir until smooth and gently stir in the cereal until it is coated in chocolate.
- Divide the mixture between the paper cases and press 3 chocolate eggs into the centre of each nest.
- Chill in the fridge for 1 hour, or until completely set.
